What the Parents Owe the Children

Psalm 127

Introduction

- 1. Children are always considered a gift in Scripture Psalm 127
- 2. The first commandment being obeyed: "be fruitful & multiply"-Gen. 1:28
- 3. We should gladly be spent for our children 2 Cor. 12:14-15

What are we spending for our children? What do we owe them?

What we think we owe them:

- 1. A good education, a big inheritance
- 2. Possessions: new phone, car, video games, toys
- 3. Baseball lessons, violin lessons, fill in the blank!

These are all physical! But this is what we really owe them:

1. Time

- 1. Quantity vs Quality Time Col. 4:5-6; Psalm 90:12
- 2. Spiritual Time Eph. 6:4; Deut. 6:4-7
 - "Bring them up" = "nourish" (like in 5:29)
 - "Training" = "discipline"
 - "Instruction" = "calling attention to"

There is only one way to see what the opposition for our kids is: spend time with them!

2. Discipline

The Goal: discipline like God – Heb. 12:5-11

- 1. Godly discipline comes from a place of love (vs 6a)
- 2. Godly discipline is punishment (vs 6b)
- 3. Godly discipline should result in respect (vs 9)
- 4. Godly discipline is short-lived & case-by-case (vs 10)
- 5. Godly discipline yields peaceful fruit of righteousness (vs 11)

3. A Kingdom Focused Upbringing

Ask yourself: what is my kid focused on?

• We don't just want "good" kids, we want "kingdom" kids! (1 Sam. 1:26-28)

How to teach your kids to have a kingdom focus:

- 1. Teach them to love & serve others (Phil. 2:3-4)
- 2. Teach them honesty & integrity (Prov. 6:17, 19)
- 3. Teach them responsibility & how to care for themselves (2 Thess. 3:10-13)

Ask yourself: what am I focused on? Be the parent!



What the Children Owe Their Parents

Ephesians 6:1-3

Introduction

- 1. Be thankful that God gave you this life Psalm 139:13-14
- 2. Be thankful that your parents followed God's command Gen. 1:28
- 3. Understand submission Eph. 5:21; Heb. 13:17



What Do I Owe My Parents?

- 1) Obedience Eph. 6:1
- 1. Obey because it is right and a command!
 - It is the "right" and natural order of things.
- ✓ This is why parents give warnings (Pro. 1:10; 3:1-4; 4:1-9, 14; ch. 5, 7; 6:1-5)
- ✓ They have more experience than me.
 - Disobeying parents = disobeying God
- 2. Obedience Listens James 1:19; Prov. 17:10
- 3. Obedience Learns Prov. 12:1; 15:5, 12, 32

2) Honor & Respect — Eph. 6:2-3

- 1. This is one of the 10 commandments Exo. 20:12
- 2. It has a promise attached to it long life! (Both physical & spiritual)
- 3. This is emphasized by Jesus Mark 7:8-13

Applications:

- 1. Show honor in the way you take care of them Mark 7:8-13; 1 Tim. 5:4-8
- 2. Show honor in the way you talk to them James 3:1-12; 1 Tim. 5:1
 - Drop the attitude!
 - Stop complaining Phil. 2:14; 1 Cor. 10:10

3) Love

- 1. Understand: Your parents love you.
 - This is how we know God loves us John 3:16
 - Important to remember this when being disciplined Heb. 12:6;
 Prov. 3:11-12
- 2. So love your parents. How?
 - In the way you serve them Phil. 2:3-4
 - Tell them you love them and are blessed to have them- Prov. 31:28
 - In the way you treat them 1 Cor. 13

The way you treat and view your parents is often an indication of how you will or do treat God!
